

PRESIDENTS' GOOD STEWARD AWARD



Timothy Allen Professor *Keene State College*

Keene State College Professor Timothy Allen has taught courses in Environmental Geology, Hydrogeology and Environmental Geochemistry at the college since 1992. He also consults within the community, with past clients including town conservation commissions and a regional land conservancy.

From 2000-2009, Professor Allen served on the State of New Hampshire Board of Professional Geologists and was recognized for his service to the state in 2009 by Governor John H. Lynch. Professor Allen has organized and led several geological field trips for students throughout the country. Additionally, he is the co-director of the Keene State Center for Environmental BioGeoChemistry, which is equipped with an X-ray Fluorescence Spectrometer for analysis of trace elements in environmental samples, funded by Professor Allen's successful grant application to the National Science Foundation.

Professor Allen has served a leadership role in the Environmental Studies major for many years and played a key part in the redesign of the curriculum and establishment of the Environmental Studies Department in 2010. The Environmental Studies Junior-Senior Seminar was designed around a community service-learning model, culminating with a public event at which faculty and students present their research results to the Keene City Council and members of the community.
